Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Do I need to have any special documents?

Many agencies and organizations will ask you for proof of identity, proof of income, and proof of residency. If you aren't sure what you might need to provide or what counts as proof, always ask!

<u>Examples of proof of income:</u> pay stub, tax return, W-2, Social Security benefits letter, Unemployment Benefits letter

<u>Examples of proof of identity</u>: driver's license, state-issued ID card, birth certificate, valid passport/passport card

<u>Examples of proof of residency</u>: lease agreement/property deed, utility bill, phone bill, bank statement

How quickly will I receive help?

Some agencies and organizations can help you right away. Other agencies may have an application process or might need to call around to find the resources you need, and this could take several days.

Other helpful information:

- Write down the date and time you call, as well as the names of anyone you speak to. Write down notes that help you remember what you asked and what answers they give.
- If you are confused by a term or a word that an agency uses, ask them to explain.
 Employees might sometimes use words that are common for their agency, but don't make sense to other people!
